Managers' and other team staff's commitment to a new cycling

Doping is extremely harmful to cycling. Currently, there is a climate of suspicion. It is undermining the credibility of my sport and is eroding the trust of the public, authorities, organizers and my colleagues.

I am aware that, even though he is responsible for his actions, a cyclist who commits any infringement to the International Cycling Union's (UCI's) anti-doping rules, is rarely solely responsible. As a member of the team's staff, I have a fundamental role to play in preventing my riders from turning to doping substances or methods.

For these reasons, I want to make a contribution to putting the situation right and making cycling clean by signing the statement below, to demonstrate that I fully adhere to the principles defended by the UCI.

"I do solemnly declare, to my team, my colleagues, the UCI, the cycling movement and the public that I am not involved in any doping case and that I will not commit any infringement to the UCI anti-doping rules. I declare that I will never encourage a rider from my team to dope himself, nor will I turn a blind eye to any doping activities that I am aware of within my team. In addition, I make a commitment to set up measures to ensure that there is no doping in my team or, as staff member, to assist those measures. Finally, I will co-operate as much as possible with procedures in the fight against doping.

As proof of my commitment, I accept, if it is established that I have been guilty of doping activities in my team in the past or in the future and that I am granted a two-year suspension or more – in the case of an appeal, when the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) has delivered its verdict –, to pay the UCI an amount equal to my annual salary for 2008 as a contribution to the fight against doping (to be managed by the Council for the Fight Against Doping (CFAD), which includes representatives of the Association Internationale des Groupes Cyclistes Professionnels (AIGCP) and of the Cyclistes Professionnels Associés (CPA)).

Finally, I accept the UCI's wish to make my statement public."
